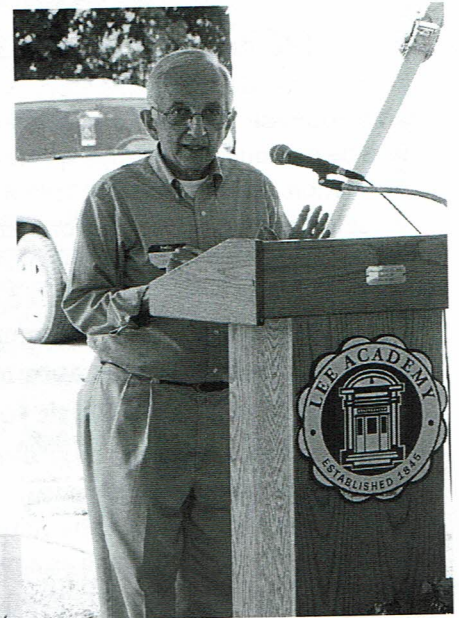
LA soccer great Deidra Ham McIntosh '02 inducted into Husson sports Hall of Fame

Leading the team to postseason play in all four seasons, Deidra, playing midfield, also was an NAC All-Academic selection in 2004-05.

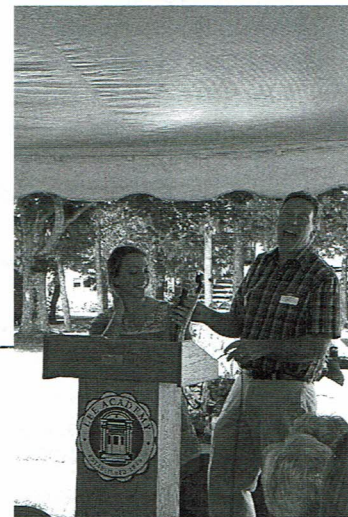
Excitement in the Science Lab at Lee Academy

## Carl MacDonald 1937-2015

It is difficult to measure the impact a family's decision might have on their child, their family, and on a small private school in very rural Lee, Maine, when it is decided to send that child 100 miles from home to attend Lee Academy.



### The Carl MacDonald Story

*Carl was the oldest of eight children born to Douglas and Annie MacDonald. Delores, next after Carl, "we were a working family. Dad owned some land. He was a woodsman. We lived on a farm with cows, hens, pigs, gardens, haying-all of it. We all worked. We had too."*

*In 1954, the small community of Masardis in Aroostook County had no high school of its own. Carl could attend the school in Ashland, but there were no busses and it was too far to walk or "hitch." A few years prior, in 1947, a Masardis boy had graduated from Lee Academy. Carl's mom and dad held Glen Sherman in high esteem. That respect and a "knock on the door" from Mr. Dingley "sealed the deal." Carl would go to Lee Academy in the fall.*

*Carl and Lee Academy were "a good fit" from the start. He became a class officer. He was in French Club, Latin Club and Student Council. Carl performed in One Act plays and was on the Crescent staff. Carl was a proud member of the "L" Club. His senior year he was voted "Best All Around," "Most Courteous" and "Brainiest." He was on the honor roll all four years.*

*His biggest success story was in the rugged sport of cross country. An excerpt from the 1955 Crescent reads, "The boys all their meets and swept over all competition at the state to win the State of Maine Championship. Carl MacDonald, a running Senior, finished a strong second-closely followed by in Crocker'55. The team then journeyed to Boston to take part in the New England Meet where they finished third behind Manchester, N. H. and Beverly, Mass. Here MacDonald and Crocker turned in outstanding performances, finishing 7th and 15th respectively."*

*Carl's next step was the University of Maine. Again, his hard work paved his way. He was a good student and also a member of UMaine's New England championship cross country team. Upon graduating from Maine, Carl retraced his steps back to the very place where four years earlier he had built the framework for his future vocation. He made his way back to Lee Academy.*







*The next seven years were busy ones. Carl taught chemistry and physical science. The labs were not as sophisticated as they are for the students in this era, resulting in a lot of "fizzles" in our experiments! He taught Driver's Ed. and also drove those old cold school buses on many a long trip for a basketball game. He was the boy's Dorm Master for two years and understood full well the value of working off demerits on the farm's manure pile! And yes! Carl coached cross country.*

*Carl ultimately taught in other places, but he remained loyal to his school through his work with the Alumni Association. He was a regular attendee at Reunion. Lee Academy touched him in some way all of his life, and he in turn touched many people.*

*Thinking back to 1951, little did Douglas and Annie MacDonald know that their decision to send their son to Lee Academy would put him on the path for his life's work. In addition, little did Mr. Dingley know that when he knocked on the door of that Masardis home, it would open the door to Delores, Alexander (Sandy), and Joyce, immediate family members, 11 direct relatives, and many Masardis students who through the years followed the path well-trodden and proven to Lee Academy.*

*"It is our hope that those alumni reading this will pause for a moment and reflect on their own school days. We hope they will remember those people at Lee Academy who were a positive influence on their life. Many alumni will remember "Mr. MacDonald" as a special teacher, coach, dorm parent and friend who was an important weave in the fabric of their school."*
