

# ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Ever since I was a little girl growing up in Springfield in the 70s, I dreamed of travelling to far off places. I read books and studied maps in our old encyclopedia set. (Who could have ever dreamed of the internet back then? It seemed as impossible as travel!) I kept boxes of postcards from family friends who mailed them to me, more relics of bygone days. I watched African safaris with Marlin Perkins of Mutual of Omaha's Wild Kingdom, and in all of this, I never imagined that any of my travel dreams might one day become a reality.

Fast forward to 1982-1986, my LA years, where I was privileged to become friends with a number of foreign students. Then, in 1994, I graduated from nursing school and moved to North Carolina with my husband and baby girl. Four years later, we had added three more kids and we were fully involved in our regular, ordinary, and very satisfying American life when one of my husband's former students dropped by our house in the summer of 2002. He was teaching in South Korea and encouraged my husband to think about looking at international schools. This was the catalyst that started us thinking about and international move, but it would be 10 more years before we finally took the plunge.

My husband, Mike, has worked as both a high school History/Economics teacher and an administrator. In 2012, he applied to four international schools in Asia and received offers from three of them. We had to choose between Indonesia, Thailand and Hong Kong. We chose the latter, most because it seemed the best fit for our three sons who would be moving with us (our daughter was already in college); nine years later, we have not regretted it.

Mike teaches AP Economics and various other Social Studies courses. Six months into our new world, the school nurse resigned with little notice and I took the job that I have had ever since. For the first time in or married life, we worked at the same location and had all the same days off. This has been ideal as we have been able to travel extensively. While here, we have visited 20 countries; it would have been more had Covid not slowed us down. But more than that, we have been immersed in a culture so different from what we knew. I know it's cliché to say it, but this changes your perspective and broadens your world. I'd like to think it's made us better, more empathetic people.

The dreams of a little girl lying in the grass and watching planes fly over in the clear, blue summer skies of Maine have come true, not necessarily in ways she would have imagined, but maybe even better. Those clear, blue Maine skies were calling though. All of our children are back in the US; family life and grandparenthood pulled us back. In June, we ended our time in Hong Kong with no regrets and moved back to our home in Lakeville, where we sit on the deck and remember all our adventures. I know God's timing is perfect.
